## WELCOME TO A MAGICAL PLAYGROUND OF SIGHTS, SOUNDS AND TASTES

**CubaDupa is Wellington's new, vibrant street festival revering the epic creative spirit of Cuba Street and the Wellington community. Over the weekend of 28 and 29 March, Wellington's most iconic street will be transformed to a magical interactive playground of delight, sound and taste.**

175 years ago, the New Zealand Company's ship 'Cuba', arrived at Port Nicholson, bringing a survey party of 25 men to plan the new settlement of Britannia. Named after this ship, Cuba Street has always been the entrepreneurial, creative and entertainment heart of Wellington. That spirit continues today.

CubaDupa is a celebration of the change of season – the last party of summer / first party of winter! CubaDupa brings all walks of life together in an immersive experience to 'get on up' during the day or 'get on down' in the evening.

The roads will become pedestrianised from Manners Street up to Karo Drive and between Taranaki and Victoria Streets (with the exception of Vivian Street) to bring Cuba Street alive with a myriad of dance, music, theatre, live street art, carnival, circus and street food.

Stages will be dotted around the site, and throughout the day and evening performers will appear at various times on stages and on the street (or roof tops!) – forming many small processions and vignettes.

Get amongst it, join the celebration and experience our iconic and beloved Cuba Street in a completely new way!

In true street festival style the premise of CubaDupa is that the audience will help create the show, with a variety of opportunities to dress up, dance and be part of the action – from flash mobs to street theatre, decor to dance bands, and much more! This is a small taste of the participation activities in store for the brave!

#### Our Songs / Ō Tātou Waiata

Midday Saturday we breathe life into CubaDupa with a mass choir involving six different choirs starting from different areas of the festival site and proceeding through the streets to converge and come together to sing as one voice for CubaDupa – join our song!

#### CubanFusion Viva Cuba Street Party

Bringing Cuban flair to CubaDupa this year with Wellington's Cuban Salsa specialists CubanFusion and Cuban Quartet Calle Cuba, and their "Viva Cuba Street" Parties, which will include a free fun follow-me class that will teach you to dance like a Cuban, ending with a Cuban Conga flash mob... all the way up Cuba Street! All are welcome to come dressed in red and white – the more white the better – and come party like a Cuban!

#### Pop-Up Arcade

Pop-up Arcade is a day and night spectacular showcasing some of Wellington's creative game-based projects. By day: they show off some cool toys and games they've been working on, and start signing people up for the tournament. By night: projector fun times! Find the Arcade in Garrett Street.

#### The Great Cuba Street Hunt

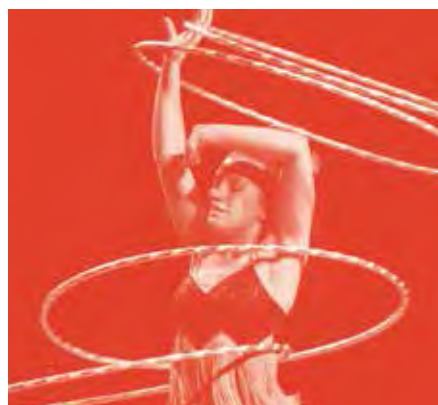

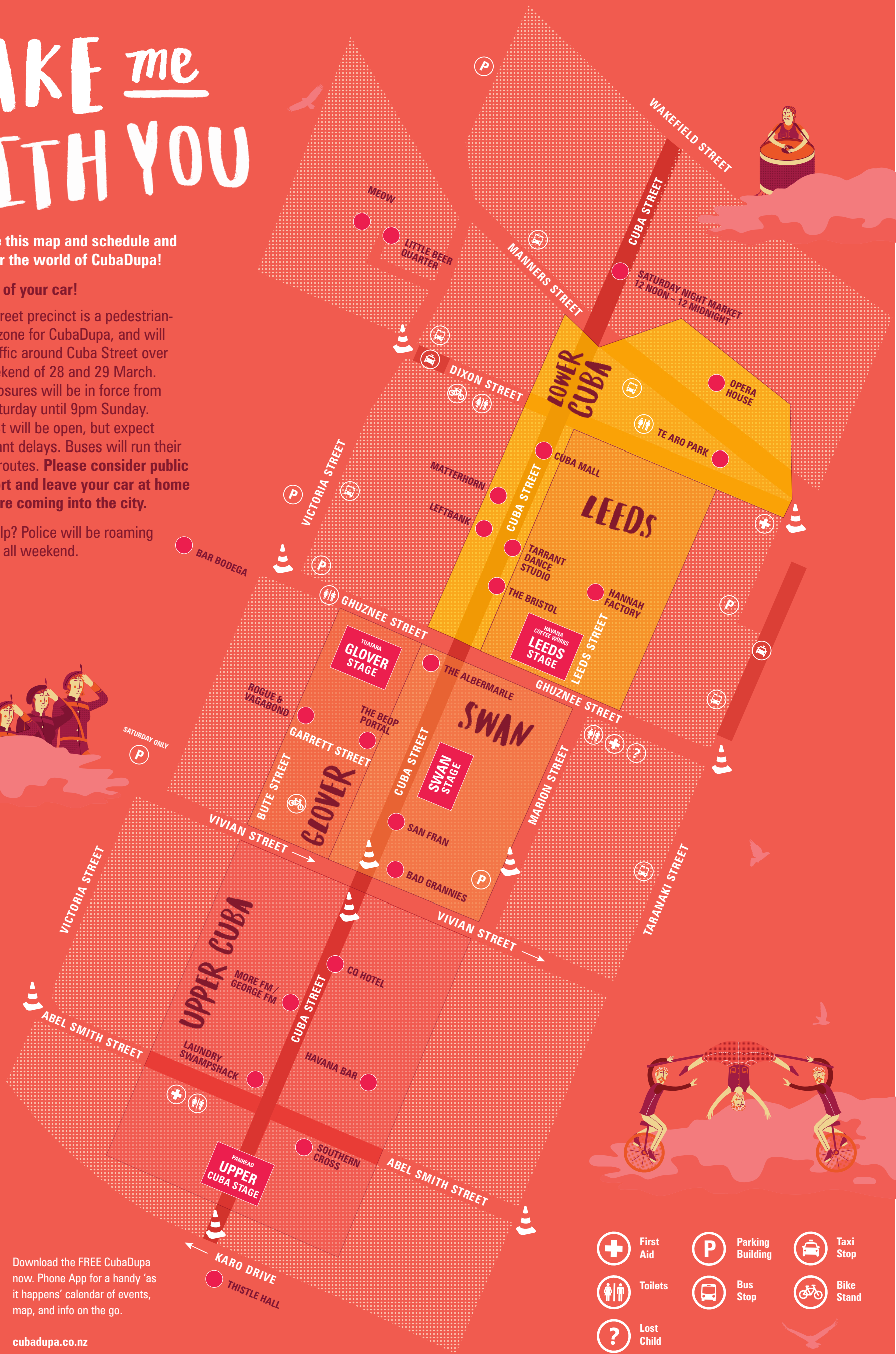

## UP ON STAGE

Four stages feature performance and music from the wild to the sublime and spectacular, travelling the genres of Americana, Hip Hop, Electro Swing, Folk and Blues. Dance the CubaDupa!

### Mass Cuba Street Orchestra

Murray Hickman and Adam Page have created a composition for a Mass Cuba Street Orchestra, including musicians from Strike, The Balkanistas, Niko Ne Zna, Richter City Rebels and Wellington Brass Band. The Mass Cuba Street Orchestra starts as separate movements in various street locations, and culminates in an epic grand finale. Supported by Westpac and Creative New Zealand.

### Carnival Bloco

Wellington Batucada is delighted to bring the vibrant rhythms of 100 Brazilian samba drummers to CubaDupa. Joined by drummers and dancers from AK Samba (Auckland), Sambatron (Hamilton), Samba de Sol (Nelson) and Bay Batucada (Hawkes Bay). Get your dancing shoes on cos you're gonna want to shake yer booty! You'll find them on stage, on the streets, and jamming in Te Aro Park on both days – and on Sunday they'll be coming together for a great big Carnival Finale to close the festival. Supported by Museum Art Hotel.

### Electric Swing Circus (UK / NZ)

The Electric Swing Circus is Birmingham based, with two ex-pat kiwis on lead vocals. It is a six-piece fusion of saucy 20's swing and stomping electro beats. With an explosive sound that reverberates back through time, the ESC hotfoot their way through everything from breakbeat and house to reggae and dubstep, all with their own unique style of swing.

### Tutakitaki (Brazil / Aotearoa)

Tutakitaki mixes Brazilian popular and indigenous music with traditional Māori music, Taonga Pūoro, bird song, and many things both cultures have in common such as microtones, floating pulse, sudden changes of pitch and rhythm, sounds of nature influencing music, singing as an extension of speech and instruments played as an extension for the word: music as message. The songs of Tutakitaki are in Te Reo Māori, Portuguese, English and Brazilian indigenous languages, such as Tupi and Maxacali. Supported by Air New Zealand, Embassy of Brazil, and NZ Māori Tourism.

### DVA (Czech Republic)

This Czech duo is a two-person dance party. Quirky and mysterious, their music is a fantastical collage of pop, kitchen beat box, tango, cabaret, circus and radio noise, wrapped around lyrics written in their own imaginary language.

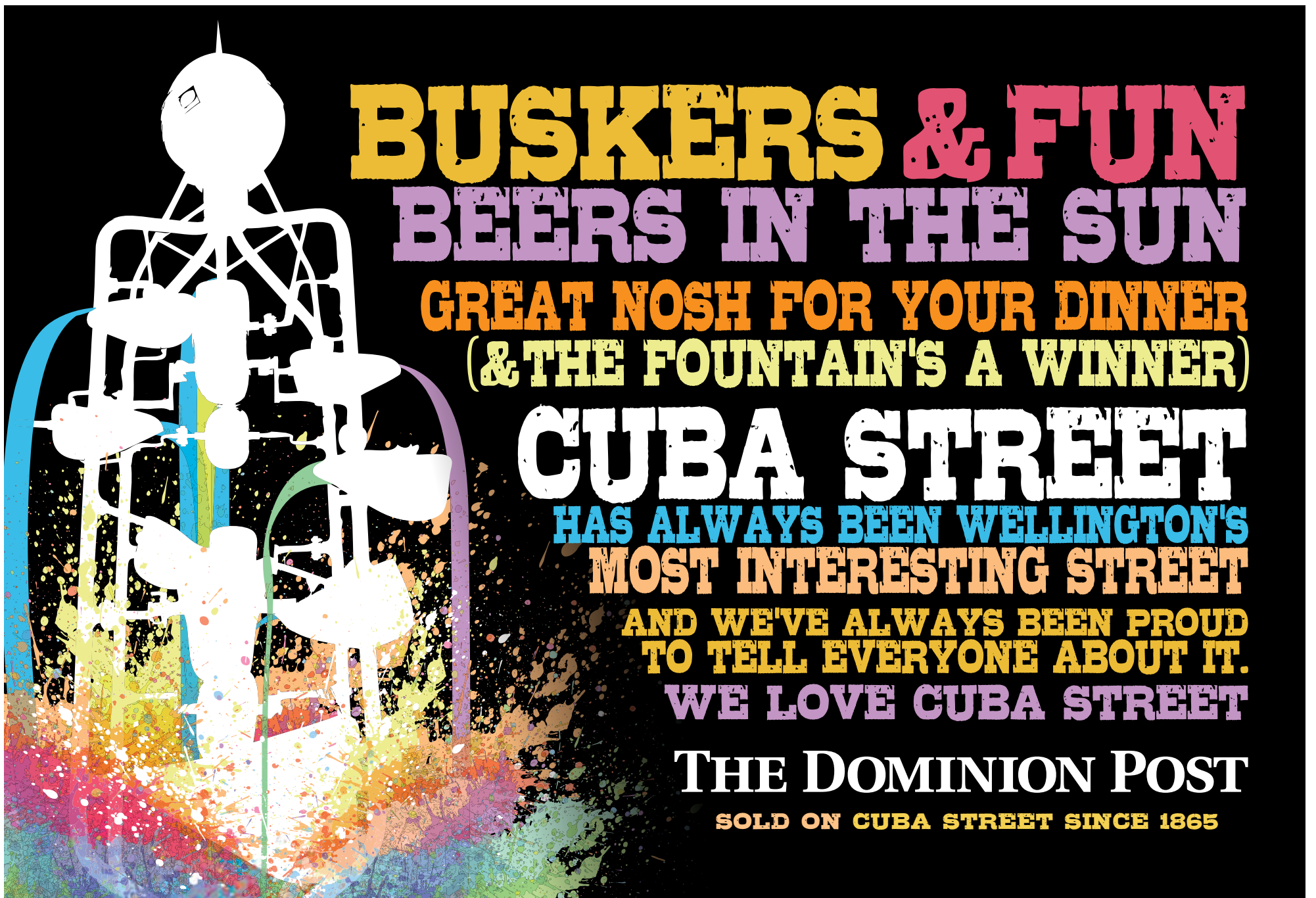

## DOWN ON THE STREET

The streets and buildings become an urban theatre filled with music, dance, performance and parades. Expect the unexpected.

### Orchestra Wellington Brass Ensemble

Orchestra Wellington presents an engaging brass ensemble programme to surprise and excite Festival-goers in the most dynamic district of Wellington City. Where and when you least expect it, streets will be drenched in powerful harmony and the warmth of trumpets, horns and tuba!

### The Beop (The 7th Dimension)

The Beop is a band like no other. Performing with extra-ordinary instruments from the 7th dimension, they communicate their songs through time via a hi-tech physical structure that enables their transmogrification to bring Electronic Future-Punk to the people of the 21st Century. Beop will commence their first major live communication with the 21st Century, through a specially engineered portal at CubaDupa Festival. Supported by Wellington Airport.

### Electric Groove Rider

The very wacky and delightful Electric Groove Rider is a unique pedal-powered mobile sound system toppling into Cuba Street with steam punk costumed theatrical dancers. Supported by Datatalk.

### Red Dress

Lauren Skogstad explores the disruptive monumentality of a female figure wearing an extraordinary red dress of epic proportions as she encounters the everyday world of the city. As we witness the spectacle of the dress, the world of our imaginations fuses temporarily with the world of the everyday. Supported by CQ Hotels Wellington.

### Osadia (Spain)

Osadia means to be daring or imprudent. The idea of this spectacular street theatre performance is to attract audience volunteers onto the stage to give them the makeover of their lives using lots of imagination, creativity, colour and humor. Hair is not a necessity here; the artists only need a head on shoulders to work with! Supported by Museum Art Hotel.

### Urban Rhapsodies – Aerial Opera

Directed by Sara Brodie – opera takes to the balconies and hidden byways of Cuba Street in Urban Rhapsodies. Divas descend from stratospheric heights, dangling from above or to be encountered up close and personal in a series of operatic escapades celebrating La Vie de Boheme that is Cuba Street. Supported by the Wellington Company and Creative New Zealand.

### The Piano

With a nod to their clown heroes – Laurel and Hardy and Tom and Jerry – Fraser Hooper and Pascal Ackermann present a brand new show from inside an upright piano they bought on Trade Me for a dollar. It's a big budget spectacular, full of laughs, cowboys, music and puppets.

### Out in the (car)Park

Wild winds can't keep the Fair down! Wellington's annual queer\* Fair is joining CubaDupa! Dubbed 'Out in the (car)Park' as a cheeky nod to its location, the Fair has stalls offering everything from rainbow flags to spray tattoos to information to upcycled art! The Fair is famous for its free entertainment and features drag queens, cabaret dancers and soulful singers.

\*Queer is a reclaimed word that positively describes lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, intersex, fa'afafine and takataapui people.
