### Friday, June 27: All Moodle units need to be completed online prior to departure for South Africa.

<u>Sunday, June 29</u>: You make your way to Atlanta Jackson-Hartsfield International Airport today where you rendezvous with your fellow participants, TA Paul Adolphsen and Professor Judyie Al-Bilali for the group flight to Johannesburg.

**Tuesday, July 1, 2014:** This morning we visit one of South Africa's foremost heritage sites – the awardwinning Liliesleaf Museum - where the journey to democracy in South Africa is chronicled and honored. In the afternoon we travel to Pretoria to explore two of South Africa's most significant monuments – the Voortrekker Monument and Freedom Park – and their performative potentials.

- 19:00 Gathers in hotel lobby and departs for dinner in Sandton (pay your own way)

<u>Wednesday, July 2, 2014</u>: This morning we visit Constitution Hill which chronicles the story of South Africa's turbulent past and explores its transition to democracy. Following lunch we drive past the celebrated Market Theatre and then take a privately guided tour of Soweto. This evening we head to bustling Rosebank to enjoy dinner at one of Professor Lewis' favorite restaurants before returning to our hotel on the Gautrain.
