When a contrast reaction occurs, the **Technologist** should:

- Call above contacts based on location not the type of study
- Report incident via Be Safe Event (Main Hospital) or OIA Incident Report (UVAI)
- Enter reaction details in study note in Epic

When responding to a call, the **Resident, Clinical Instructor, Fellow, or Attending** should:

- See the patient, assess, and treat as needed
- Communicate with referring LIP
- Write note in EPIC & document allergy in EPIC
- Include reaction details in the radiology report
